Welcome Rev. Brad Simpson



My hometown is Charlotte; however, growing up, I traveled with my family to visit aunts, cousins, etc. who live in Cleveland and Gaston Counties. I was raised in a family where "going to church on Sunday" happened every week. At an early age, I was taught about God's love and I learned many of the stories in Scripture. I learned about God's grace and God's gift of love in Jesus Christ and I was surrounded by friends and family who reflected their faith through their love and compassion. In 1969, at age 8, we joined Covenant Presbyterian church, the congregation that will always be my "home church."

At Covenant, I became very involved in the mission outreach, youth, and music programs and, as a young person, I was encouraged and invited to participate in the various activities of the church. I worked in the clothing closet and volunteered in other ways and I discovered a deep joy within myself as I participated with others in helping people in need. I participated in several conferences at Montreat and felt very excited about my faith. At age 13, following my completion of the God and Country program of Scouting and Confirmation at church, I began to feel more and more that ministry might be my calling in life. This sense of call reflects the sincere joy, excitement, and hope that I continue to experience serving God as a Pastor.

My journey in the faith included seven amazing years of study at Davidson College and Union Presbyterian Seminary. At both schools, my faith was challenged in many ways; however, through these experiences, my faith was ultimately strengthened as I gained a clearer understanding of God and the story of God's omnipotent, loving involvement in our lives. I also learned to appreciate and learn from people of other faiths and that appreciation continues to grow in me today. My faith is always faith that seeks understanding.

Between college and Seminary, I served for four years in the U.S. Army, specifically in the Quartermaster Corps. As a Platoon Leader stationed in Germany for most of these years, I worked in warehouses full of supplies, including food that was distributed to 5 Army dining facilities.

Following graduation from Union Presbyterian Seminary, I served as Pastor of two churches in Duplin County for six years, as Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Concord for five years, as Pastor of Wytheville Presbyterian Church in Virginia for 16 years, and as the Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Sanford for four years. Throughout these years of ministry, I have been surrounded daily by many friends and families who reflect their faith through their words and actions of love, justice, and compassion.

I enjoy hiking, traveling, bicycling, camping, Scouting, and playing the tuba in a community band or orchestra. I sometimes play golf and always enjoy sampling different types of cuisine! In Scouts, I earned the Eagle and God and Country Awards and also completed Woodbadge training and was honored to receive the Order of the Arrow Vigil and Silver Beaver recognition. I served as a Chaplain at four National Boy Scout Jamborees (2005, 2010, 2013, and 2017).

My family includes my 95-year old mom (Rita) who lives at Sharon Towers in Charlotte, my brother (John) and his wife (Trish), my niece (Alyson), and my nephew (Rad) and his wife (Ashley).
